

Welcome Information and Accommodation Code of Conduct



Important Notice:

All information contained in this document is specific to residents on the MV Diamond XI. Ensure you have read and understand this document in its entirety, inclusive of "Important Information", "Accommodation Code of Conduct", as well as all other Bridgemans Floatel LP and Bridgemans Expedition LP policies and procedures. Failure to adhere to the information contained in this document or as otherwise outlined will result in the withdrawal of accommodation privileges.

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Important Information**Personal Protective Equipment (PPE)**

To ensure that the floatel is a comfortable home away from home, all work boots should be stored in your assigned cubby in the boot room on Deck 2. Ensure you have a clean pair of indoor shoes to change into, helping to keep the Vessel clean and in good condition.

Emergencies

Emergency evacuation and response drills will be held in accordance with the floatel's operating class and flag state requirements. You will be notified of upcoming drills through the information displays located throughout the public spaces of the floatel, and on the ShipNet channel on your cabin television.

If you are onboard during a drill or a real-world event, follow the directions given by the Captain and the crew. If there is a call for all residents to make their way to their Muster Station, please proceed accordingly. Should you have any questions in this regard, don't hesitate to ask any crew member.

Please note that tampering with fire suppression equipment and the fire alarm system is against the law. Do not touch or hang items from the fire suppression nozzles on the ceiling of your cabin, as this will initiate the system and result in your cabin being flooded.

Smoking

Smoking in any area of the Vessel is strictly prohibited except in the designated smoking area located on Deck 4 aft. This includes the use of e-cigarettes.

Rubbish and Cigarette Butts

No rubbish or cigarette butts are to be discarded overboard. This is in violation of the floatels regulations and maritime law. All waste should be segregated into the appropriate bins, located throughout the Vessel.

Cabin Key Card

A key card will be provided at check-in. This key card is unique and must be inserted into the door lock and left until the door has been opened. You may remove the key once the door has been opened. If you lose your key card, immediately report this to the Reception Desk on Deck 4, where a new key card will be issued.

Checking Out

Should you be checking out of the Vessel, be sure to notify the Reception Desk so we can prepare your cabin for the next occupant. Your cabin key card must be returned to the Reception Desk prior to departure.

Rules and Regulations for Residents

The MV Diamond XI is your home away from home, therefore; the rules and regulation in this document have been established for the benefit of everyone living on-board. They,

along with normally accepted standards of community behaviour will be enforced for the benefit of everyone onboard. Failure to comply with the Accommodation Code of Conduct may result in the withdrawal of accommodation privileges. Unacceptable conduct onboard the MV Diamond XI will not be tolerated.

Prohibited Items

Prohibited items on the MV Diamond XI include, but are not limited to the following:

- The possession of, or use of unauthorized firearms, weapons and explosives
- Posting on any wall or placing in public view, including your cabin, pornographic material or material of a like nature which could offend others
- The possession, manufacture or use of any illegal drug or substance, corrosive or obnoxious substance of like matter
- Drug Paraphernalia
- Alcohol
- Cannabis products
- Candles, incense or other materials meant to have an open flame
- Animals or live pets of any kind
- Any illegal item, implement or subject matter whatsoever

A full list of prohibited items can be found in the Accommodation Code of Conduct.

Personal Property

Residents should ensure that their personal belongings are protected against fire, flood, threat, etc. Bridgemans Floatel, Bridgemans Expedition and any of its contractors or subsidiaries will not accept responsibility for any claims in this respect. Always ensure your cabin door is securely closed and locked, each time you leave your cabin. Vessel crew will ensure that your cabin door is locked and secured after servicing or performing maintenance.

General

In consideration of others aboard, residents are required to leave the dining room, lounges, public spaces and all other facilities in a clean condition after use. Unsanitary use of any facility or acts against acceptable hygiene standards are unacceptable behaviour and will not be tolerated.

In the case where residents require a sanitary means of disposing of syringes and other sharp materials, please contact the Reception Desk on Deck 4.

Feedback

An important aspect of our service to you is understanding where we are doing well, and areas which may need improvement. We invite you to speak with any of our managers or Reception Desk team members regarding any issues that may arise during your stay. Additionally, you can submit your feedback through the feedback form on our web app (www.diamondxi.brgmans.com).

Maintenance Requests

Should you have a maintenance request that requires attention, please visit our web app (www.diamondxi.brgmans.com) and choose 'Maintenance Request' to complete the provided form. Our team will review your request, and have it dispatched to one of our engineers for resolution. If your maintenance issue is urgent (IE leak, power outage, etc.) please visit us at the Reception Desk, or dial '999' for immediate assistance from any internal telephone.

MV Diamond XI Evacuation Procedures

The Vessel's Captain is responsible for the safety and security of everyone onboard. This includes emergency evacuations and the training, monitoring and provision of competent emergency personnel. These duties are not taken lightly and your full cooperation with the direction of the Captain and crew in drills and real-world events is required. Please respect and follow the directions given by the ship crew so that they may ensure your safety as well as the safety of the Vessel.

You are required to familiarize yourself with the floatels evacuation map, and with the location of your Muster Station. Take time to review the safety information card on the back of your cabin door.

Evacuation Procedure

1. In the event of an emergency requiring evacuation, an alarm will sound consisting of seven short blasts, followed by one long blast of the ship's horn.



2. Upon the sounding of this alarm, you must evacuate your cabin and follow directions given by the crew (this is in accordance with the Accommodation Code of Conduct and Vessel rules. Proven breaches will result in disciplinary action);
3. Please dress appropriately for the weather (hat or headwear, warm clothing, rain attire, etc.), as quickly as possible;
4. You will be directed by the crew to your Muster Station, and further instructions will be given;
5. Do not re-enter the floatel until all clear has been given by the Captain.

Housekeeping

Our housekeeping team strives to provide a clean and hygienic environment for you to live and work in. Each cabin has a specific schedule for general cleaning, as well as linen and towel change. Your cabin will be cleaned once a week, and your towels and bedding will be changed. Should your cabin be deemed too cluttered and messy for our crew to safely work, this will be reported to your employer for correction.

Cabin Features

As we are on a Vessel, there are a few things to be aware of in your cabin:

- The toilets are like those on an airplane, in that they operate on a vacuum system. Note that only items intended to be flushed down the toilet may be so, any foreign objects such as hair, feminine hygiene products, sanitizing wipes or excessive

amounts of tissue or toilet paper are not permitted as they may plug the system. Only the toilet paper provided onboard is to be flushed down the toilet, as it is specially formulated to handle the ship's vacuum system.

- Power onboard is 220v (European standard), 60hz. Power adapters are available at the retail kiosk on Deck 4 (opposite the Reception Desk). Foreign devices with a heating element can malfunction and catch fire (e.g. hair dryer, straightener, curling iron, space heater, etc.). Devices such as laptops and cellphones will typically have a built-in power converter which will ensure your device is protected for the higher voltage. These devices, however, should never be left plugged into the socket unattended. If you are unsure if your device is safe to plug into the electrical system, check with your device's manufacturer, or visit the Reception Desk on Deck 4.
- When using the shower, ensure that the door to your washroom is closed, so the steam from your shower does not set off the heat sensor in your cabin. Additionally, this will stop any water from flowing onto the carpet in your cabin.

Personal Laundry Service

Our wash and fold laundry service are available once-per-week on a day specifically assigned to your cabin number, which will be communicated upon check-in. Please use the laundry bag provided in your cabin and drop off all laundry at the designated drop-off point on Deck 3 by 07:30 on your assigned laundry day to ensure processing. Your washed and folded laundry will be delivered back to you within 24 hours of the drop-off deadline.

Dining Room

The dining room serves two meals per day (breakfast and dinner), with menus on the public information displays. Menus are designed for single serving portions. Floatel management reserves the right to limit unusually large servings or portions at any time.

The removal of dishware or food from the dining room is strictly prohibited, as is any type of cooking in your cabin. Residents found removing dishware or food from the dining room for any other reason may have their accommodation privileges revoked.

The dining room dress code must be followed, and the wearing of work boots, jackets, coveralls, PPE, hard hats, ball caps, workout attire, flip flops or any other inappropriate attire is prohibited. Such items must be removed prior to entering the dining room. Please see the complete dining room dress code on our web app (www.diamondxi.brgmans.com).

Backpacks, personal food containers and lunch bags, coolers, purses, computer bags, etc., are not allowed in the dining room.

Floatel provided reusable beverage containers are permitted.

Residents shall refrain from the use of headphones and ear buds while in the dining room, except when seated at a table. Headphones or ear buds are required when making phone calls, watching videos, or listening to music.

Please inform our chef of any food allergies or dietary concerns, for medical or religious reasons, to ensure we meet your requirements.

Recreation Facilities

The MV Diamond XI has assorted lounge and recreation facilities available throughout the Vessel. The main fitness and recreation area is on Deck 6. In addition, there are two additional outdoor decks on the aft of Decks 7 and 8.

When using the Gym, all residents must comply with the following rules:

1. Use the Gym at your own risk and responsibility.
2. Proper gym attire must be worn.
 - a. Shoes must be clean.
 - b. No sandals or flip flops.
 - c. Shirts must be worn at all times.
3. Return all equipment to proper place after use.
4. Spray and wipe all equipment after use.
5. Do not drop weights.
6. No loud music. Use of personal headphones is mandatory.

Follow the manufacturer's instructions for intended use of equipment. The removal of any equipment from the gym is not permitted. The intentional damage, alteration to or sabotage of equipment is strictly prohibited, and those found to be partaking in such actions will have their accommodation privileges revoked.

Maintain a respectful and courteous demeanor towards others utilizing the facilities. Intimidation, abuse or inappropriate behavior will not be tolerated.

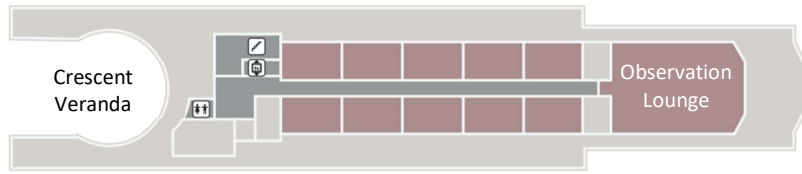
Lost and Found

Any items discovered onboard not belonging to you should be turned to the Reception Desk. Should you have lost an item, please come by to see if it has been turned in. Items will be held for three (3) months, or until the completion of the project (whichever comes first).

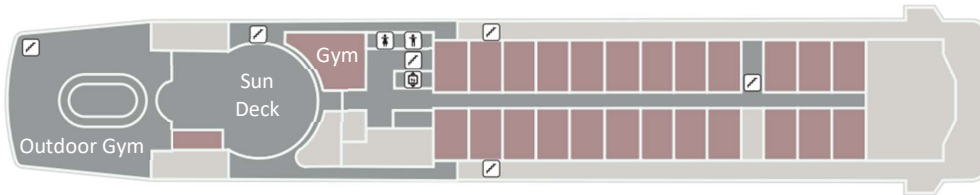
Boot Room

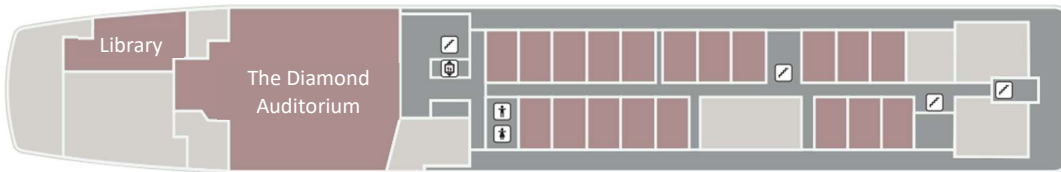
Ship Layout Diagram



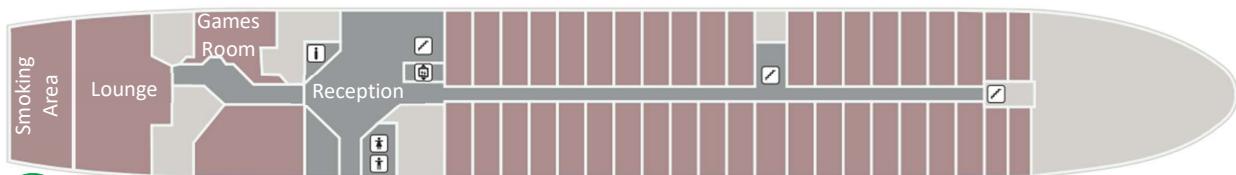
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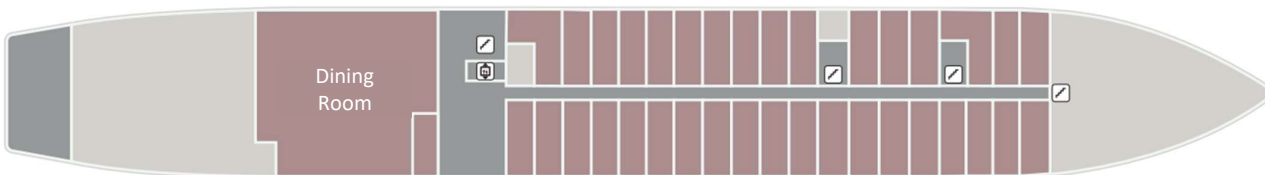
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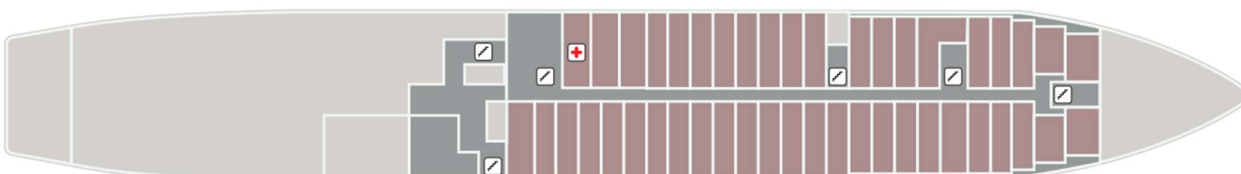
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ACCOMMODATION CODE OF CONDUCT

MV DIAMOND XI

You are required to make yourself familiar with these conditions of accommodation as set out herein and as amended from time to time.

Securing accommodation on the floatel is a privilege that requires your informed consent from the outset, and continued conformity with the rules set out in this agreement. Any violation of the rules set forth in this agreement could result in your immediate removal from the facility and suspension of further floatel privileges.

**KEEP YOUR CABIN LOCKED WHEN NOT OCCUPIED AND
KEEP YOUR KEY CARD WITH YOU AT ALL TIMES.**

1.0 Introduction

This Accommodation Code of Conduct applies to all individuals onboard the floatel and forms part of your conditions of employment and shall be read and understood prior to signing.

You acknowledge that it is a condition of this Accommodation Code of Conduct and your conditions of employment that:

- a) The legal right to possession and control of the accommodation remains vested in Bridgemans Expedition LP and your employer at all times.
- b) You have a personal right to boarding and lodging on the MV Diamond XI, on the terms specified in this Accommodation Code of Conduct and terms of employment, and you have no interest in nor any right of exclusive possession of the accommodation;
- c) This Accommodation Code of Conduct applies to your behavior on the floatel.

2.0 Requirements**2.1 Emergency Procedures**

You will be inducted to the MV Diamond XI's emergency evacuation procedure upon check-in. This will include the location of fire prevention equipment and procedures.

In addition to this however, you should take the time to study and understand the emergency procedures, layout, evacuation routes, muster stations and be familiar with alarm signals in the event the ship or any part of it needs to be evacuated in an emergency.

Emergency evacuation procedures are located on the rear of the door to every cabin and are prominently located throughout the Vessel. This information must not be removed or obstructed.

2.2 Precautions Against Fire

Be constantly vigilant in fire prevention. Potential cause of fire and fires are to be reported immediately to the nearest crew member.

Firefighting equipment is to be used to fight fires only.

The interior of the Vessel is a non-smoking area and smoking will only be allowed in designated places outdoors. Ashtrays must be used. Absolutely no butts or trash are to be thrown overboard as these can be blown into lower

decks, air intake or into the water, which is against the law. No open flame, burning of flames, candles or incense is permitted onboard at any time.

2.3 Cabin Key Cards and Access Control Cards

Your cabin key card and access control card must be carried with you at all times. The access control card is required to be scanned every time you board and depart the Vessel.

2.4 Meals

Meals will be provided in the dining room during posted times. Meal service will not be available outside of posted times unless your employer has approved prior arrangements (i.e. scheduled overtime, night shift, weather days, etc.).

A pre-made lunch bag will be provided for you outside of the Dining Room on Deck 3, upon your departure from the floatel. If you have any dietary restrictions or allergies, please speak to our chef.

Meals and foodstuffs (other than lunch bags) are not to be taken out of the dining room without prior approval of floatel management.

Crockery, cutlery, utensils and items or materials of any kind are not to be removed from the dining room or other food and beverage outlets.

Minimum dress code requirements for all residents in the dining room must be adhered to. This includes a sleeved shirt, shorts (no cut-offs or swim wear), shoes or sandals with socks of reasonable cleanliness (flip flops are not permitted). Work clothing worn in the dining room must be of a reasonably clean condition and meet posted requirements. PPE or high visibility clothing is not allowed in the dining room, nor is sweaty gym clothes and headwear, aside from religious head coverings. Please refer to the posted signage for additional information.

2.5 Accommodation

Cabins will be allocated by your employer, and cabin changes will not be permitted without their prior approval. All residents must have residency approval authorized prior to checking in.

Residents are not permitted to share beds or to allow unauthorized persons to live or stay in their assigned accommodation cabins. Visitors or non-residents granted temporary access to the Vessel are not permitted in accommodation cabins.

All residents must complete check-in and check-out formalities through the Reception Desk upon arrival and prior to departure, as well as partake in onboarding orientation and safety programs within 24 hours of arrival.

Damage to cabins will be notified to the employer who will be invoiced for repair or replacement as deemed necessary by Bridgemans Floatel and Bridgemans Expedition.

Resident cabins will be serviced once weekly, at which time bed linen and towels will be changed.

For health and safety, hygiene, occupancy verification and maintenance purposes, authorized persons may regularly enter cabins to conduct cursory inspections. Such assessments will typically be limited to Bridgemans Expedition management and housekeeping team members, floatel management and engineering crew members, and security, as required.

Inspections of resident cabins may include the use of certified drug detection dogs to detect the presence of illicit substances. Drug dog inspections will also be conducted in common areas, game rooms, and of personal items in short term storage areas such as the boot room.

No structural alterations, removal or rearrangement of fixtures, alteration or extension of electrical wiring or circuits is permitted.

Each resident will be allocated the following items in good order and clean condition.

- Two (2) pillows, pillow protectors and pillowcases
- One (1) mattress protector
- One (1) fitted sheet
- One (1) duvet and duvet cover
- Two (2) bath towels (per Guest)
- Two (1) hand towels (per Guest)
- One (1) bathmat (per cabin)
- One (1) laundry bag (per Guest)
- One (1) TV remote controller

If at any time during your stay, or upon check-out, one of the above or any other item is noted as missing from the cabin, this must be notified to the Reception Desk immediately. A replacement fee of \$20.00 or fixed price

determined by floatel management may be issued.

Accommodation cabins are to be maintained in a clean and hygienic condition by residents. Where housekeepers are not able to perform their duties due to clutter, a note will be left advising the resident of the repeated instance and the employer will be notified.

Personal routers, access points, satellite dishes or other devices found to interfere with floatel systems are not permitted and will be removed when found in a resident cabin.

Security cameras are located throughout the Vessel for safety, surveillance, and investigative purposes. Any attempt to cover, block, damage, disable, move, or remove a security camera will result in the immediate revocation of accommodation privileges.

2.6 Reporting Maintenance Issues

To ensure maintenance issues are corrected in a timely manner, residents must report defects and malfunctions of any equipment or facility via the submission form on the MV Diamond XI web app, (www.diamondxi.brgmans.com). Maintenance issues may be reported to the Reception Desk, though we encourage use of the web app whenever possible. If your maintenance request is urgent (IE fire, flood, electrical), contact the nearest crew member or the Reception Desk directly.

2.7 General Hygiene and Sanitation

Residents are required to leave toilet, washing and shower facilities in a clean condition after use. Unsanitary use of any facility and acts against acceptable hygiene standards is not acceptable.

All residents must comply with any Public Health protocols as stipulated by the local regulators or the federal government.

2.8 Personal Property

Residents should protect their personal belongings against fire, flood, theft, etc. Bridgemans Floatel and Bridgemans Expedition will not accept any responsibility for any claims in this respect.

2.9 Recreation Facilities

Recreation facilities are available for use during specific hours and people utilizing these facilities must be properly attired.

The recreation facilities and equipment are for the specific use of authorized residents and authorized visitors only. Equipment is not to be removed from any facility without the express permission of Bridgemans Floatel Management.

Recreation facilities of any kind are for the enjoyment of all residents and are required to be left in a clean state after use. All recycling and trash are to be properly segregated and disposed of in the bins provided.

2.10 Drug and Alcohol

The transportation to, or consumption of personal alcohol onboard the MV Diamond XI is strictly prohibited. Failure to comply with these restrictions will result in disciplinary action including and up to the revocation of accommodation privileges. The MV Diamond XI is a “dry facility.”

You are required to be familiar with the Drug and Alcohol policy, which applies on the floatel.

- The use, possession or sale of alcohol is prohibited,
- Alcohol consumption will not be tolerated at any time, under any circumstances. Personnel showing signs of alcohol or drug impairment will be removed from the floatel and face revocation of accommodation privileges.

The use, possession or sale of cannabis products (all forms), illicit drugs, controlled substances and drug paraphernalia is prohibited. Drug paraphernalia includes, but is not necessarily limited to, items normally associated with drug use as such as “bongs” and “hash pipes” (homemade or otherwise) or normal items (lighters, grinders, rolling papers, vape devices, etc.) when said items are used in preparing or consuming cannabis or illicit drugs.

- The use, possession or sale of any item used to circumvent or defeat drug and alcohol testing is prohibited. This includes, but is not limited to, synthetic urine and “whiz kits”.
- Any drugs for which a prescription is legally required in Canada must be accompanied by a valid prescription in the individual’s name. Prescription medication includes all forms of steroids, animal or human hormone, hormone boosters, peptides, and estrogen blockers. Individuals found in possession of prescription drugs without a valid prescription in their name will be subject to immediate suspension of their Vessel privileges, and a likely Project ban.

2.11 Electronic Noticeboard

Notices may not be placed or posted except on the authorized electronic noticeboards and only with the prior approval of the Bridgemans Floatel Manager. Any approved notices shall be periodically removed at the discretion of the Bridgemans Floatel Manager.

2.12 Prohibited Items

Items prohibited onboard include, but are not limited to the following:

- The possession, consumption and/or distribution of illicit drugs or cannabis products, including synthetic varieties meant to imitate the effects of illicit drugs, corrosive, obnoxious or similar substances;
- The possession, consumption, and/or distribution of prescription drugs for which a prescription is legally required in the United States of America – unless, in the case of consumption only, the owner has a valid prescription in his/her name, and he/she has previously reported the use of the prescription drugs to his/her company management. Note: Prescription drugs include all forms of steroids, steroid boosters, estrogen blockers, and animal/human growth hormone type products.
- The possession and/or distribution of alcohol;
- Any other mood-altering substances that can affect a person's fitness to work or has a negative impact on fitness for duty;
- The possession of, or use of unauthorized firearms, weapons and explosives (including fireworks);
- Bows and crossbows;
- Other weapons such as spears, darts, boomerangs, slingshots, or any other weapon that fires a projectile;
- Unauthorized ammunition and arrows/bolts;
- Explosives and/or blasting caps (unless required for work, and with proper permits and permissions);
- Illegal or offensive weapons (i.e., brass knuckles, switchblades etc.);
- Tasers;
- Clubs, truncheons, or batons (expandable or fixed);
- Axes, hatches, swords, machetes, and any knives with blades greater than 3.5 inches. Knives and retractable blades are permitted on the work site for work use only;
- OC (pepper) spray or mace (unless authorized by Project Manager for wildlife protection/monitoring etc.);
- Traps or trapping gear (including snares);
- Fishing equipment or tackle;
- Biohazardous waste;
- Drones (unless approved by your employer);
- Posting on any walls or placing in public view, including your cabin, pornographic material or material of a similar nature which could give offence;

- Animals or live pets of any kind; and
Note: Drug detection dogs and animal visits approved by floatel management are permitted.
- Any illegal items, implement or subject matter whatsoever.

3.0 Standards of Behavior and Rules

Conformity with normally accepted standards of community behavior, project work rules and this Accommodation Code of Conduct is expected on the floatel for the benefit and wellbeing of all residents and crew. Unacceptable conduct on the MV Diamond XI will not be tolerated and will be dealt with in accordance with the guidelines of the project:

- Racism, bullying, abuse, or harassment of any kind (verbal, physical, sexual, or mental) is prohibited. Disrespectful, vulgar, or demeaning comments on clothing or any inappropriate badging on t-shirts, jackets, backpacks, hats, or other personal items is prohibited. This includes clothing supporting criminal organizations.
- All personal property must be secured in resident cabins by residents. Floatel management assumes no responsibility for lost or stolen property.
- Criminal activity is prohibited and will result in the immediate removal of the individual. Criminal or civil lawsuits may also be pursued against the individual. Criminal acts include, but are not limited to:
 - Theft
 - All forms of assault
 - Threats
 - Sexual offences
 - Sabotage and other forms of willful or deliberate damage to property.
- It is important that all individuals are respectful of the environment, contributing to a clean and tidy worksite. Improperly stored food as well as garbage can attract wildlife, creating dangerous situations. The feeding of wildlife is prohibited.
- Horseplay or any other activity that could result in damage to floatel property is prohibited. Costs of any damaged property, including the costs of removing graffiti, and items damaged or removed from the Vessel, are the responsibility of the registered resident causing the damage. Damage could also result in a suspension of floatel accommodation privileges.
- Unauthorized weapons are prohibited on the floatel. This includes:
 - Firearms
 - Ammunition
 - Explosives

- Slingshots
- Martial arts paraphernalia
- Clubs, truncheons, and expandable batons
- Items deemed as illegal or dangerous weapons (i.e., brass knuckles)
- Archery equipment, including bows, arrows, crossbows, and bolts
- Mace or pepper spray
- Bladed items such as swords, machetes, axes and large knives.
Note: Only knives authorized by Project Management for the site are authorized.
- Smoking, vaping, and the use of chewing tobacco are permitted only in authorized, designated smoking areas.
 - Smoking in resident cabins will result in a minimum \$500.00 cleaning fee, and the immediate loss of accommodation privileges.
 - All smoking materials must be disposed of in the provided disposal containers, situated in the authorized smoking areas.
- Tampering with or removing safety devices, such as smoke detectors, CO₂ detectors, fire extinguishers or any similar safety devices anywhere in the floatel will result in the loss of floatel accommodation privileges.
- Designated quiet times in the floatel are between 22:00 to 04:30.

Residents are reminded that in the event of floatel access being revoked for a breach of the Accommodation Code of Conduct, access to the site may also be revoked.

3.1 Misconduct

The following forms of behavior constitute Misconduct; proven breaches of which will result in disciplinary action being taken. Conduct which constitutes 'Misconduct,' includes but is not limited to the following and may result in documentation and disciplinary action for the person or persons confirmed to be involved, up to and including the withdrawal of accommodation privileges:

- Unsanitary use of any facility and acts against acceptable hygiene standards
- Riotous, drunken, or noisy behavior
- Provocative or insulting language or offensive behavior (including that directed to Bridgemans or Bridgemans Expedition crew members or contractors)
- Causing a nuisance to others, or causing a disturbance
- Posting of posters or displaying of a sexually explicit or pornographic nature anywhere within the Vessel including accommodation cabins

- Refuse to present floatel key card when requested
- Refusal to adhere to dining room regulation procedures and/or rules
- Failure to observe dress code in the dining room, recreation rooms or other common areas
- Failure to maintain accommodation cabin and washroom facilities in a clean and hygienic condition
- Breaches of the Accommodation Code of Conduct

3.2 Serious Misconduct

The following form of behavior constitutes Serious Misconduct; breaches of which will result in disciplinary action, which may include, immediate withdrawal of accommodation privileges pending an investigation.

Conduct which constitutes 'Serious Misconduct' includes, but is not limited to the following:

- Negligence or willful acts, which cause and/or have the potential to cause fire, including the use of candles or incense
- Improper disposal of "sharps"
- Alcohol, cannabis products, illegal drugs or other prohibited items being brought onto the Vessel
- Smoking or vaping in designated non-smoking areas, which includes but is not limited to all accommodation cabins, washroom facilities, locker rooms, within 3 meters of doorways and windows (open or closed), recreation facilities, offices, the dining room and near air intake vents
- The inappropriate use of, tampering with, willfully damaging of firefighting equipment, including firefighting extinguishers, alarms, hoses, smoke detectors, sprinkler nozzles, etc.
- Abuse of, or damage to accommodation facilities and amenities
- Fighting, and/or offensive, intimidating, or violent behavior (either initiating, and/or in response to actions of another)
- Harassment of any kind (including on the basis of sex, religion, race, ethnicity, color, ancestry, age, sexual orientation, or impairment)
- Inciting or abetting others to commit offences

- Possessing or consuming alcohol anywhere onboard the floatel

- Theft of, or unauthorized use of, property belonging to another person, McDermott, Bridgemans Floatel or Bridgemans Expedition
- Willful refusal to comply with safety, security, hygiene, environmental and/or accommodation rules and/or instructions
